Saturday, 14th May, 11.00 a.m. onwards - Stoke Poges. Mildred Slatter, a member of the C.P.A., and a fellow of the Society of Designer Craftsmen has agreed to be our hostess on this occasion. She trained at Reading University and the Central School. Mildred has exhibited widely in this country and makes stoneware and porcelain. A Raku kiln will be fired on this occasion and glazes will be available but bring your own biscuit pots. The clay body used should have some refractory material in to make it more 'open'. This will ensure that the pot survives the thermal shock encountered in the firing. Mildred has agreed to help with any problems - throwing, glazing and so on so make it a day. Bring food, wine and most important of all WOOD for the kiln.

Wednesday, 25th May, 7.30 for 8.00 p.m. - Celebrity Demonstrator, Slab Pottery - West Marshall at Chorley Wood Arts Centre, Colly Lane, off Common Road, Chorleywood.

WEST MARSHALL is a quiet, reserved inexorable force. With devastating logic and directness he does "what Wests gotta do". After one week at Harrow in the Dress Design Department he decided that a mistake had been made! He joined the Pottery Course. No humbug employed by Public Administration has ever got the better of him for their own advantage and convenience. Vatmen, Taxmen, College Principals without principles, rates valuers and other territorial rip off merchants roll like ninepins before his immaculate steadfastness. Behind the apparently still person there is a crisp and agile mind and a wry humour that can startle the unwary. His pots express this. After completing his pottery and lithography course, and doing the necessary year for his teaching chit demanded by the empire builders of education he emigrated to Canada selling Wedgwood door to door rather successfully in his role of quiet Englishman. Returning in 1968 and finding Harrow now had a proper pottery course for real potters he did the final year of it and then started his Whittington Pottery at Stoke Ferry in Norfolk. His work is live and true and

there is nothing slapdash about it. His workshop is a model corder and every tool he makes and uses (and he invents a great number) is as beautifully conceived as his pots. While Council Member of the C.P.A. he asked for a greater professionalism from membership besides the encouragement of experimentation. He is an all round potter making both domestic and individual work.
