
Friday April 10th at 8 pm Northchurch Social Centre, Bell Lane, Northchurch, Berkhamsted.

JILL FANSHAW KATO

Born in Nottingham, Jill graduated in Painting from Chelsea Art School and later went to Japan, where she lived for six years and studied pottery intensively at the school of Bizen potter Yosei Itaka and at the Musoan Karatsu Pottery School in Tokyo.

She now lives with her husband, a Japanese photo-journalist Setsuo Kato, in North London where she established her studio and gas kiln with a grant from the Crafts Council. She produces functional pots for Japanese and English use and also creates architectural and sculptural ceramics. Jill's work is inspired by nature and her travels in Asian countries. Tropical birds, exotic flowers and leaves and wild animals are used as decoration.

She has had ten one-woman exhibitions in Japan and has also exhibited in England and the USA. She teaches pottery at Goldsmith's College and Lambeth Institute and lectures on Japanese ceramics for the Japanese Embassy in London.
